

University of Northern British Columbia (UNBC): Tier II Canada Research Chair in Cumulative
Impacts of Resource Development

UNBC invites applications for a Tier II Canada Research Chair (CRC) in **Cumulative Impacts of Resource Development**. This professorship will enable an already outstanding researcher to maximize their contribution as a center of research and research training in this area.

Human enterprise is reshaping the Earth's surface to provide the space and raw materials for its burgeoning population and demanding lifestyles. Large-scale resource developments, such as the myriad of projects underway and on the horizon across much of Canada's north, present step changes in how and where natural resources are exploited. These projects serve to open up large intact areas and enable the growth of extractive industries. The cumulative impacts, both positive and negative, of resource development include social change, public health effects and environmental impacts.

Applicants must have an outstanding record of research for their career stage, having demonstrated exceptional early capacity for research in the field of cumulative impacts for resource development. The successful candidate will be expected to establish an active, externally-funded research program, including funding from one of Canada's three research councils (SSHRC, NSERC and/or CIHR), as well as supervise graduate students and post-doctoral fellows. Applicants must demonstrate a track record of engaging in interdisciplinary and cross-disciplinary research to understand cumulative impacts, and they must also demonstrate the potential to build research collaboration across the university community. The program of research proposed by the applicant must align with UNBC's [Strategic Research Plan](#), provide rich research training opportunities from graduate and undergraduate students, and contribute to developing interdisciplinary academic networks within the institution and beyond.

Located in the spectacular landscape of northern British Columbia, UNBC is one of Canada's best small universities. We have a passion for teaching, discovery, people, the environment, and the north. UNBC provides outstanding undergraduate and graduate learning opportunities to explore cultures, health, economies, and the environment. Tier II Canada Research Chairs are intended for exceptional emerging scholars who are within 10 years of receiving their PhD. Applicants who are more than 10 years from having earned their highest degree (and where career breaks exist, such as maternity, parental or extended sick leave, clinical training, etc.) may have their eligibility for a Tier II Chair assessed through the program's Tier II justification process. UNBC advocates for equity in its hiring practices, and is committed to ensuring that all eligible candidates are considered fairly for all positions, including the position of Canada Research Chair.

A Tier II Chair nomination will be submitted soon after a successful candidate has been selected. Chairs are awarded by the Tri-agency Institutional Programs Secretariat in Ottawa after a rigorous evaluation. The UNBC appointment will be conditional on a successful Canada Research Chair nomination.
