ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OFFICER

Help build infrastructure and stimulate economic growth in rural and urban communities. They act as liaisons between the local government and local businesses.

INTERNATIONAL TRADE ANALYST

Researches various international marketing sources to gather information on international trade issues. Prepares analytical charts outlining international trade performance.

POLICY ANALYST

Works for international organizations implementing and developing social policy. Work on key policy issues with political liaisons to groups outside the organization.

INVESTMENT BANKER

Completes research required for investment banking transactions between institutions with long-term capital needs and major investors. Researches broad industries and the specific financial status of particular institutions and prepares reports to present to staff and clients.

REAL ESTATE DEVELOPER

Explores the real estate needs of particular communities, gathers information about available parcels of land, and explores the market feasibility of proposed projects.

ECONOMIC ANALYST

Researches, compiles, analyzes, interprets, and prepares data on economic conditions. Conducts surveys for determining and analyzing economic conditions such as occupational employment, employment statistics, wage information, labour supply and demand, tax revenues, and insurance and utility rates.
