HEALTH EDUCATOR

Asses, plan, and implement health education programs. They evaluate the effectiveness of the programs, act as a resource for the programs, and promote health education. Work In hospitals, schools, and public agencies.

HEALTH CARE ADMINSTRATOR

Hospital administrators plan, direct and coordinate health and administrative services provided by hospitals, community health services and other health service organizations.

HEALTH & WELLNESS PROGRAM PLANNER

Develop and implement programs that encompass health & wellness topics such as stress management, nutrition, and fitness. They work to increase the productivity and decrease the amount lost when employees are sick.

BIOMEDICAL ENGINEER

Develops concepts and converts the ideas of physicians, rehabilitation therapists, and biologists into usable devices, procedures, treatments, and techniques to improve the quality of patient's life.

OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY OFFICER

Coordinate health and safety systems in an organization. They identify hazards and assess risks to health and safety, put appropriate safety controls in place, and provide advice on accident prevention and occupational health to management and employees.

ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH OFFICER

Environmental health officers develop, regulate, enforce and monitor laws and regulations governing public health, building and environmental management, in order to promote good health, hygiene and environmental practices.
