## WHAT CAN YOU DO WITH YOUR DEGREE?

### ARCHIVIST / HISTORIAN

Acquires and organizes records and documents, verifies authenticity, and significance of historical material. Conducts tours and gives lectures and presentations on historical topics. Works for libraries, historical museums, and historical sites.

### MUSEUM INTERPRETER

Museum interpreters conduct tours of museums, gallery exhibitions, and historical/heritage sites. Answers inquiries and provides information relative to exhibitions and sites.

### HISORICAL RESEARCH ASSISTANT

Does historical analysis, studies policy issues, prepares analytical reports, and coordinates interdisciplinary studies. Works for universities and public research agencies.

### POLITICAL CAMPAIGN WORKER

Assists in planning, fundraising, research, writing issue statements, and accessing voter attitudes. Works for political candidates or interest groups during political election campaigns. Frequently leads to permanent positions with political organizations or office holders.

### PRESERVATION / RESTORATION COORDINATOR

Plans and conducts historical investigations related to restoration projects. Performs preservation and restoration of historical material, structures, and administer the implementation of projects. Works for museums, historical sites, and public and private historical agencies.

### APPRAISOR

Conducts research, verifies the value of historical artifacts, antiques, art, and other material.

### GENEALOGIST

Researches and curates documents pertaining to the origins of family names. Works for government and public agencies.
