

 - It has been a perception in the past that the regional students were getting a 2nd class university experience (video conference courses) but, this year, it was appreciated that some of our

- regional students could access PG-based courses that they previously did not have access to hoping this can continue
- Using Collaborate and online conferencing this year has enabled Faculty to participate in Department meetings more fully rather than just being a voice on a polycom
- Faculty have increased their skills in multiple online delivery methodologies (lecture captures, Blackboard Learn, Collaborate, etc). And have gotten a lot more comfortable teaching online.
- Actively thinking about how we can keep some of these things in the coming Fall keeping doors open for students and Faculty.
- Learning Commons and online tutoring have been good for students
- Melinda & Eric (Regional Campuses) have an open door policy all are welcome to ask questions or make suggestions to Regional for how they can communicate better about what's available (eg. they have a couple of experiential courses coming up this summer)
- We have many mature students even in the PG area that benefit from this diversity of service and offering
- Engaging students requires ensuring that campus clubs and PG campus activities are also offered in the regional campuses
- I wonder if having more space on the website dedicated to the regions, campus life on the regions, what's happening etc. can allow for more integration of what is happening. It still feels like the majority of the Website is focused solely on PG.
