## **Knowledge Creation**

SUMMARY OF PROGRESS

The HRI serves as the Secretariat for PHSA-NH-UNBC **Seed Grant Program** that aims to foster the development of new partnered research teams to create knowledge that focuses on northern issues and improving the quality of health services and population health in Northern BC. Each team is awarded up to \$10,000 for one year. Since 2015, **twenty teams** have received funding that focuses on the following areas:

#### Rural Coordination Centre of BC
