	The mandatory private health insurance will last for 4 months and is \$220 CAD. The charge for this will be automatically placed on your student account.
	Please be aware, even if you already have health insurance, you will still be enrolled in this insurance. If you have already purchased insurance, check with your provider about getting a refund before your coverage begins. Insurance coverage will begin from the time of departure.
	All international students will be automatically enrolled in health insurance. This insurance is mandatory for all new international students. No other medical insurance, aside from British Columbia's Provincial plan, will be recognized by UNBC.
Health and Hospitalization Insurance	As an international exchange student, UNBC requires that all students have health insurance while studying.
	Since this is a study program lasting more than 6 months, you must obtain a study permit. We recommend that you begin your immigration process as soon as you receive the admission letter from UNBC, as the process can take up to three (3) months. Please visit canada.ca for full details on what is required to apply for a study permit.
