PPE for Medical Students:

NMP Year 3 students are expected to use Northern Health provided PPE supplies for clinical experiences within each hospital departmental setting. Students scheduled for outpatient/community/family practice clinics will bring eye protection (goggles) with the understanding that other PPE will be provided by the Preceptor as per normal universal precautions in these clinics.
