# A focus on family medicine in Quesnel

A graduate with the \*UBC Northern Medical Program (NMP) Class of 2023, Dr. Stephen Freschi spent four weeks in Quesnel on a family medicine (FM) elective placement just ahead of his spring convocation. He is currently pursuing a FM residency in his hometown of Prince George.

#### Why did you pursue this particular clinical placement?

I knew that I wanted to pursue family medicine after completing medical school and thought a 4-week FM elective rotation to culminate Year 4 would be a great opportunity to refresh on FM topics and responsibilities! Plus, I chose a rural community rotation to gain more hands-on experience in the wide range of duties that rural family physicians can have and how they can manage so many complexities with limited resources.

### What were some highlights of your placement experience?

I would say the main highlight of the rotation was the inherent collegiality of a tight community and professional team. Everyone knew each other by first name no matter which department we were in and were genuinely helpful

and kind to me as a student coming through being unfamiliar with the processes. This even included patients outside of the healthcare system. I was also able to openly go join and talk to other specialists and professionals anytime to learn more about their roles with no hesitation.

#### Anything else that you would like to add?

I think one of the largest takeaways I have, especially from this rotation and the rest of this educational journey, has been appreciation of the investment from others to help guide your success. This is all your preceptors and faculty valuing you and treating you as a colleague offering support, other healthcare workers helping you treat patients and understand collaborative roles, and patients eagerly willing to take time with you and patiently agreeing to have you practice your clinical skills with them. All of this was very encouraging and something to be thankful for! Especially motivating when we can return the service someday soon.
