#### Researcher Profile - Gary Wilson, Political Science

Each month *The Northern Voice* will feature a short profile of a faculty member or student who is involved in northern research.



My research and teaching covers a wide range of northern topics. In the past I focused much of my attention on regional politics and intergovernmental relations in the Russian North. More recently, I have broadened the geographical scope of my northern research to include northern Canada and the Circumpolar North. I am particularly interested in Inuit multilevel governance and have published articles on the political

evolution of the predominantly Inuit region of Nunavik in northern Quebec, and on Inuit diplomacy and the Inuit Circumpolar Council, a transnational organization linking Inuit peoples in countries across the Circumpolar North, I am also exploring the political and economic development of the provincial norths and have recently done research on the impact of the new Prince Rupert container port on communities across northern BC.
