Ethnobotany Summer 2019 Instructor: Dr. Carla Burton

This course will review traditional plant use worldwide and by First Nations in British Columbia. Special reference will be made to First Nations in northwestern B.C. The course will be organized around food, medicinal, technological and spiritual uses of plants.

Topics covered will include traditional ecological knowledge (TEK), research protocols, basic phytochemistry and contemporary issues in ethnobotany.

No prerequisites required but knowledge of basic plant anatomy and identification would be helpful.
