This is an immersive course in the identification, taxonomy, and ecology of mosses and liverworts of western Canada, with an emphasis on the identification and ecology of species of northern and coastal British Columbia. Students will gain practical and theoretical foundations in bryophyte anatomy, morphology, reproduction, physiology, ecology, and conservation through daily lectures, labs, and field trips. Pre-requisites: First-year Biology.
