Where are they now?

Mandy Murphy (Willsey) graduated from the Terrace Bachelor of Education program in 2009. This was the 1st Cohort at the Terrace Campus. Upon graduation, Mandy accepted a position with an Independent School in Redstone, BC. She was introduced to a skill based model which allowed students to continue moving up through grades but be accelerated in their subject level once levels were obtained. This model differed from the public school curricula but showed great results. Mandy then moved back to the Terrace area and worked part-time at the Kitsumkalum Adult Learning Centre. She assisted in the expansion of the program by working on a welcoming environment, cultural learning, community events and relationship building with teens new to the program. Mandy was very inspired by both experiences and is now an integral part of the Child Development Centre in Terrace where she is in the role of both Supported Child Development Coordinator and Consultant.
