



Upper Fraser Sustainability Snapshot 2008 A Report of the Fraser Basin Council to Residents of the Upper Fraser Region

The Fraser Basin Council was formed in 1997 to unite community groups, business and four orders of government towards the goal of sustainable decision making for protection and advancement of the Basin's social, economic and environmental dimensions — now and into the future. The Indicators Program is mandated, by a Board of 36 Directors, to report on the status and trend of sustainability at multiple spatial scales. The Upper Fraser Sustainability Snapshot, released in November 2008, offers residents within the Robson Valley, Prince George area and Stuart/Nechako an opportunity to learn about the state of sustainability in their communities. The snapshot pulls together key indicators and data on a number of topics relevant to the region and showcases examples of communities and organizations working to achieve sustainability.
