*Students must complete six credits of university-transferable English courses for which Langara College awards credit.

To receive the Diploma in Social Service Worker (Co-ordinated), students must successfully complete the Certificate in Social Service Worker and a minimum 30 credits including a minimum 24 credits of university-transferable³ courses that have science, social science, or humanities attributes, and 6 credits of any course eligible to be used towards a Langara College credential.

Unless students transfer in courses earned before they began the Social Service Worker program, they must complete the 30 credits at Langara. Refer to Co-ordinated Programs information for details.

Transfer Credit Breakdown – Admission for September 2022:

Total Transferable Credits¹ – 60 credits

Liberal Arts & Sciences² – 42 credits

Diploma Completion – 18 credits

¹ Transfer credit is based on students taking all of the recommended course work noted above.

² Students are required to complete a minimum of 48 credit hours of liberal arts and sciences coursework. This breakdown is based on accreditation and is necessary to obtain a Bachelor of Social Work Degree from UNBC.

Please note: Completing this diploma will result in being 6 credits short of the Liberal Arts & Sciences admission requirement for UNBC. These credits can be completed while you are working on your UNBC Bachelor of Social Work Degree, these credits **must** be completed before you will be eligible to graduate from UNBC.

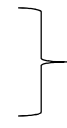
